



Men's Second Chance Living

Achieving long-term recovery from addiction starts with desire and commitment, and then relies largely on the community where individuals live. Men's Second Chance Living (MSCL) provides the living space, expectations, guidance, and support needed for men living in recovery to build back their lives and become productive and trusted members of their communities.

MSCL knows that providing a fully supplied, well-maintained house gives residents pride in their home and encourages the accountability that strengthens trusting relationships and creates community. In its 2019 grant cycle, WRWF recognized that early support was key to creating that high-value living space for residents of the MSCL House through a \$20,000 grant; in 2020, members committed another \$20,000 to this impactful program.

NAMI-Wood River Valley: Bluebirds

Reaching for the wide green marker to finish up his poster, a middle schooler shares about his day. The white board in front of the group prompts the Bluebirds to talk about what brings them peace.

Just a year after NAMI-Wood River Valley (NAMI-WRV) launched its Bluebirds program, its success could be seen in rapidly growing attendance at weekly meetings across several middle and high schools. Along with self-referrals, faculty, school social workers,

and friends had begun referring students to this safe place where they could build relationships with peers who also struggled with loneliness, suicidal ideation, self-harming, and other mental health issues.

Today, NAMI-WRV's staff offers weekly Bluebirds meetings at six schools, and because struggles don't stop when school gets out, Bluebird Summer Camp offers continued support, providing a bridge from year-to-year.



"Mental illness is a community problem that requires individuals, families, and organizations working together to provide support. 



Creating, funding, and operating a 300+ volunteer-driven collective giving foundation requires organizational procedures, legal compliance, and financial accountability. Multiple actions have been implemented in recent years to ensure that WRWF continues to thrive. We have:

- Moved to our own 501(c)(3) status.
- Initiated a Strategic Plan to build a sustainable infrastructure.
- Launched an Endowment Fund to provide long-term sustainability.
- Created a Legacy Giving Program so that members can make a forever-impact.
- Developed Future Forward to assure a strong leadership pipeline.

With a well-established record of achieving community impact through collective giving and a healthy supply of optimism for the future, we closed 2020 with two new initiatives: Future Forward, a membership category focused on women aged 50 and younger to ensure a sustainable membership; and Focus Grant 2022, a large-scale pilot grant intended to make a major impact on education disparities in Blaine County.

These new endeavors signal our commitment to embracing changing needs in the Wood River Valley and beginning our journey to inclusion. They make clear that WRWF leadership is focused on sustaining the foundation's future by developing emerging leaders. And they ensure that our work carries forward with vibrancy and vision. 
